- 8. More than 1
 executor-it can be a
 good idea to appoint
 more than 1 executor (an
 executor is the person
 who administers the
 estate of the deceased)
- 9. Gift over clause-do

you need a "gift over" clause to benefit your grandchildren in the event of your child predeceasing you?

Common mistakes when making a will

10. **Alternative executors**-if you appoint alterative executors your will fails for uncertainty

11. A witness or his spouse cannot benefit under the will

12. A will is **revoked by marriage**, but not by divorce

Trusts

A will trust allows you to put assets into the ownership of trustees for the ultimate benefit of someone else.

13. Lack of clarity causing the will to fail

If you don't make a will

14. If you don't make a will, an intestacy arises

15. Your estate will be distributed in accordance with the Succession Act, 1965-not as you might want it

16. Who can administer your estate will be dictated by Court Rules

17. Your assets can be a target for creditors

Trusts can be important in protecting assets which might otherwise be at the mercy of creditors.
